RANDOLPH COUNTY COMMISSION SS:

At a regular session of the County Commission in and for the aforesaid County and State, at the Wees Annex, on the 3rd day of October, 2024 at 1:30 p.m.

Present: Randolph County Commissioners David Kesling and Chris See. Randolph County Commission President, Chris Siler was absent.

Meeting called to order by Commissioner Kesling

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

MINUTES:

Commissioner See moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting that was held on September 19, 2024, as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

REPORTS:

911/OEM Director Michael Miller gave a handout to each Commissioner of his report. He said due to the high winds on Friday September 27th the 911 Center lost power. He said for some reason when the power went out it did not transfer to the generator so they had to run on battery backup for about 20 minutes. He said Mountaineer Generator service came and manually started the generator. He said several breakers were tripped and there was a smell of burnt wires coming from the plotter but nothing was found. He said he called Master Service to check out the electrical system and Casto Technical was called to get the HVAC system back up and running. He said the roof is still leaking at the 911 Center and Duarte's Roofing out of Clarksburg is still working on it. He said they are still working on a price list for an Amateur Radio for the OEM/911 Center in the event the radio communications would go down.

Sheriff Elbon reported that he recently talked to Motorola about getting two LPR's (License Plate Readers) for the Sheriff's Department. He said the Commission approved this to be purchased out of the Opioid Funds. He said it will alert them if a stolen car drives by and they want to place these in high traffic drug areas. He said there will be an App on every Deputies cell phone to alert them if a stolen vehicle appears. He said the portable ones cost about \$6,000.00 and they use a sim card.

County Clerk Brenda Wiseman gave an Election report. She said her office is working on receiving and sending out Absentee Ballot requests at this time. She said they have mailed out approximately 180 ballots so far. She said the last day someone can request an absentee ballot is October 30th. She said there will be a public test of the voting equipment on October 18, 2024 at 10:00 a.m. in the main Courthouse Lobby and everyone is invited to attend. She said Early Voting will begin on October 23 and run thru November 2nd at both locations as in the past.

Hannah Fincham from the WVU Extension Office introduced Mikea Franklin who is their new employee. She said they are very excited to have her. She also said 4-H enrollment started that week.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Commissioner Kesling announced that the next meeting of the Randolph County Commission will be held on October 17, 2024 at 1:30 p.m. in the Wees Annex. He said they will have an Opioid Committee meeting afterwards. He also announced that the courthouse and all annex buildings will be closed on Friday October 4th for the Forest Festival and Monday October 14th for Columbus Day.

Commissioner Kesling announced that the Enforcement Agency will meet on Tuesday October 15th at 11:00 a.m. in the Wees Annex.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION:

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDING TO THE STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA TAX DEPARTMENT FOR THE UNPAID TAXES OF THE WHITMER WATER ASSOCIATION AND FINAL DECISION ON COUNTY SUPPORT TO CITY OF ELKINS ON WHITMER WATER (See copy attached)

Commissioner Kesling said he reached out to the County Clerk's Office to see how many State Tax Liens were recorded for Whitmer Water Association and there were five. He spoke to Rita Dunlap at the WV State Tax Department and she gave him an amount of \$7,655.26 to pay off those liens thru October 18th. He said they also finally received the letter from the Internal Revenue Service from what they already paid. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the payment of \$7,655.26 to the WV State Tax Department to pay off the five tax liens on Whitmer Water Association and that is to be taken out of coal severance funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

Commissioner Kesling said they also want to let the City of Elkins know what the Commission can and can't do. Jerry Roberts and Wes Lambert from the City of Elkins were present. He said the Commission has already helped out a lot with paying \$3,500.00 on the water plant, \$20,000.00 in Audit fees, \$24,140.00 for water taps, \$36,161.00 for City of Elkins fees, \$19,600.00 in IRS Liens and now \$7,655.26 in State Tax Liens. He said that is over \$110,000.00 the Commission has helped with. He said the Commission cannot help out with the ONM fees or the Bond. He said the County will continue to help out with any tax liabilities. He said there are still several quarters of taxes that have not been filed yet. He said for the City of Elkins to let the Commission know when they find out how much those taxes are. He said he knows that this was an unfunded mandate that was thrown onto the City of Elkins and the Commission wants to help out with what they can. Wes Lambert said they appreciate their help. He said a few new customers have come on board and people have been paying their bills on time. Jerry Roberts said some people are still using their Wells. She said the drought did not seem to affect them.

INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION AND FUNDING REQUEST FOR AIRPORT TOWER SITE (See attached copies)

911/OEM Director, Michael Miller appeared before the Commission along with a representative from Premier Construction. He said the Commission had some questions about the submitted invoices. Miriam from Premier Construction went over the invoices with the Commission. It was determined that both invoices had not been paid. One was in the amount of \$45,463.05 and one was in the amount of \$10,623.40. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the invoice for the work done for the Airport Tower in the amount of \$45,463.05 and that is to be taken out of ARP Funding. All yes – Motion passed unanimously Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the invoice in the amount of \$10,623.40 for the work done on the Airport Tower and that is to be taken out of ARP Funding. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

Miriam from Premier Construction said there will still be a balance due of \$74,712.50 after what is paid today. She said that will be to complete everything for the Tower.

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF WV COURTHOUSE FACILITIES RESOLUTION (See copy attached)

Commissioner Kesling said this is a grant that Peggy Ross applied for in the amount of \$100,000.00 to help with ADA at the Old Jail. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the Resolution for WV Courthouse Facilities Improvement Authority 22nd Cycle Grant, as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE JUSTICE AND COMMUNITY SERVICE FY 2024 JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT RESOLUTION (See copy attached)

Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the Justice and Community Service FY 2024 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG), as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REAPPOINTMENT TO THE ENFORCEMENT AGENCY (See copy attached)

Commissioner Kesling moved to reappoint Ray LaMora III and J.W. Jones to the Randolph County Enforcement Agency beginning immediately and ending on August 31, 2026. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE FIDUCIARY COMMISSIONERS REPORT ON THE ESTATE OF THOMAS D. GARDNER (See copy attached)

County Clerk Brenda Wiseman, presented the report and recommendation to the Commissioners from Jennifer Morgan Fiduciary Commissioner. Ms. Morgan could not attend the meeting. The Commissioners read the recommendation and discussed it. Commissioner Kesling moved to accept the recommendation of Fiduciary Commissioner, Jennifer Morgan, on the estate of Thomas D. Gardner, as submitted. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

CONSIDER APPROVAL OF FUNDING REQUEST FROM AUTUMN ON THE DRY FORK (See copy attached)

Rex Vance, President of the Dry Fork Recreation Center, Inc. appeared before the Commission. He said they had enough money raised to do the heated floor in the recreation center but then they were told they had to have an Architect and that took a lot of the money. He said they will be having their annual fall festival, Autumn on the Dry Fork, on Saturday October 12, 2024. He said they will be making apple butter and apple cider and there will be music and vendors and chicken and pork dinners. He said they can't hardly find jugs for the apple cider this year and everything is going up in price. Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the funding request from Autumn on the Dry Fork in the amount of \$2,500.00 and that is to be taken out of Hotel/Motel Tax funds. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

Melissa O'Brien, External Affairs Manager of CityNet appeared before the Commission. She said the federal government is providing 1.2 billion dollars in funding for 60 regions to provide internet access to unserved addresses in Counties. She said she was not there to ask for any money. She said they just need a letter of support which is due October 24, 2024 to the West Virginia Department of Economic Development. She said this will allow them to apply to the West Virginia Broadband Equity Access and Deployment program. (WVBEAD) Commissioner Kesling moved to approve the WVBEAD letter of support. All yes – Motion passed unanimously

On September 3, 2024, John M. (Michael) Farley mailed a letter contesting the amount he and his wife received pursuant to the Last Will and Testament of Thomas D. Gardner, letter attached hereto. Below is my report on my denial of said contest.

Under Article Two of the Last Will and Testament of Thomas D. Gardner, the bequest to Mr. Farley and his wife reads as follows, "I give and bequeath the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars and no cents (\$25,000) to Michael and Phyllis Farley currently of Albuquerque, New Mexico, provided at least one of them survives me."

The executrix, Virginia Royce, mailed a check to Michael and Phyllis Farley in the amount of \$25,000.00, attached hereto.

In his letter, Mr. Farley asserts that both he and his wife were each to receive \$25,000.00. The check mailed by the executrix was to both Mr. Farley and Mrs. Farley.

As a fiduciary commissioner, I am unable to interpret a Will, therefore I deny this claim on jurisdictional grounds.

Recommendations to Randolph County Commission for the Estate of Thomas D. Gardner:

It is my recommendation that the following be approved by the Randolph County Commission in regard to the issues raised by Mr. Farley's letter:

Because I am unable to interpret a Will, Mr. Farley will need to file a petition in the Circuit Court of Randolph County, West Virginia, to assert his claim. I would recommend that he seeks legal representation and take action immediately. The decedent died March 15, 2024. The estate is ready to be closed but for this assertion.


